He used the photography and sales models of highly successful studios in Montana (annual sales over \$1.5M) and Portland, Oregon (annual sales over \$4M), but opted not to have a physical location, choosing instead to personalize his service by photographing and selling at his clients' homes.

After investing in some equipment and doing some invitational sessions to create marketing materials, Mike began working in/at his clients' homes in central Massachusetts, and quickly spread throughout Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, and Connecticut. Since starting in 2012, Mike has grown his business from absolute zero with no assets to annual sales goals of over \$500K, without use of a physical studio or salesroom.

Ken Sklute has been honored as one of Canon's Explorers of Light, a designation shared by several top photographers worldwide. Ken has enjoyed a diverse career photographing people, professional sports,



architecture, weddings and landscapes. Ken spends much of his time photographing, teaching and lecturing both nationally and internationally.

Ken began his photographic career capturing 200 mph race cars in New York at an early age. He soon moved into the wedding and portrait industry, working for a volume wedding studio for three years before moving into working for different independently-owned studios. Ken bought his first studio in 1983 in New York, working at the finer locations throughout the New York metropolitan area. He chose to relocate to Phoenix, Arizona in 1996 in order to be out in the landscape of the beautiful desert Southwest and to enjoy the Phoenix wedding market.

During Ken's 42 year professional photography career, he has accomplished the title of "Photographer of the Year" in 32 out of 38 years in the states of New York, Arizona and California. Ken is a PPA Master of Photography and Photographic Craftsman. In addition, Ken has been awarded 14 Kodak Gallery Awards, the Kodak Gallery Elite award, WPPI Grand Award for Weddings and 15 Fuji Masterpiece awards, amongst many other awards.

Some of Ken's clients have been the National Hot Rod Association, U.S. Army, Sports Illustrated, Oakley, Associated Press, National Dragster, Epson, Kodak, Newsday, as well as most of the photographic industry trade magazines.

Opening remarks and vendor welcome 7:00 p.m. There were 58 in attendance with 50 meals paid for. Roland Lemire, President

Second Vice President Jennifer Raiche then introduced the following vendors who were present at the meeting (in order of presentation):

- Eric Arnold, Hunts Photo and Video [www.huntsphotoandvideo.com]
 Eric expressed his gratitude to the membership for their business in 2016 as well as the
 previous nine years. This is Eric's 10th year with Hunts. Eric also thanked the membership for
 the referrals and stated the Manchester location has grown because of this association. Hunts
 always has special discount offers and pricing available. Hunts works with a number of
 manufacturing reps. With Eric tonight was Stan Kaplan who is the manufacturing rep for
 Manfrotto, Lastolite, Avenger, Gitzo, Gossen, as well as other products. Stan is a good resource
 for technical questions with regard to any of these products.
- 2. Bud Thorpe, SOPHA The Studio of Photographic Arts [www.thesopha.com] Many members were able to take a tour of the facility during the recent Christmas party which Bud hosted. SOPHA is a photo cooperative of sorts. They offer training, equipment rental, and studio rental. SOPHA is a membership-based community, but also offers services to nonmembers. Fully equipped studio rate is \$25/hour. Studio A is 25'x75'. Studio B is suitable for client meetings or in-person sales. Bud has service brochures available and also has brought the Profoto B1 Air and B2 Air rental equipment with him if anyone is interested in looking at.
- Steve Bedell on behalf of American Color Imaging [www.acilab.com]
 Since Ken Wilson was unable to attend, Jennifer Raiche called upon Steve Bedell to say a few words on behalf of ACI. Steve has been a long-time client of ACI which is located in lowa. When Steve visited the facility he was impressed by their precision and quality control. Mark Lane is a fanatic about it. ACI has many niche products from canvas prints to metal prints and albums. ACI is also a generous supporter of NHPPA.
- 4. Candace Pratt Stiteler, NEIPP (New England Institute of Professional Photography)
 This is a week-long retreat scheduled for April 2-6, 2017 at the Resort and Conference Center at
 Hyannis, Mass. If anyone is interested in signing up or has any questions, they were encouraged
 to contact Candace. Her contact information is available in the brochures which were
 distributed to those in attendance. Registrations are currently above where they were last year
 at this time.

Candace informed the membership that the NH NEIPP Trustee position will be available as of June 1. Don Chick will be finishing his maximum term as Trustee at the end of May. Anyone interested needs to submit their resume along with a cover letter by the application deadline of March 1. Interviews will be conducted by the Board of Trustees at NEIPP. A nomination will be made to the PPANE Board at the June meeting. This position has a 3-year term commitment and requires that you be available for NEIPP from Saturday through Thursday to assist with whatever is needed in running the school. This is a completely volunteer position; no pay. An email blast will be going out and will be in the next issue of the *Hyponeer* newsletter.

- Dennis Spaziano, PPANE (Professoinal Photographers Association of New England)
 Currently working on contracting speakers for the conference in September. All members were encouraged to check out the website www.ppane.com and to pay their annual dues if they have not already done so.
- 6. Tim Cameron, PPA (Professional Photographers of America) The national convention ImagingUSA will be held in San Antonio, Texas on Sunday, January 8, through Tuesday, January 10, 2017. Tim encouraged any who are not members of PPA to consider joining. The cost for annual dues is less expensive than having to purchase your own equipment insurance. Photo care insurance of \$15,000 is provided to each member. Other highlights of membership include: indemnification trust, Photovision tutorials, perks and savings available on website, as well as the merit and degree program. Tim also encouraged members to consider earning their CPP degree. Both Tim and Don Chick serve as CPP Liaisons and will help you through the process. Tim also let the membership know that our very own Jeff Dachowski sits on the Board of PPA as a Director.

The meeting took a short break allowing all members time to visit with the vendors present.

The Annual Business Meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. by President Roland Lemire.

Secretary Lauri West was called upon to present the Minutes of the last Business meeting held on January 6, 2016 and which were published in the November 2016 and January 2017 issues of the Hyponeer. A motion was made to accept the Minutes as presented. Motion seconded and passed.

Treasurer Michele Spaziano was called upon to provide the Treasurer's Report. Michele presented a summary of the current assets for the Association totaling \$110,199.06. (See Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2016.) A motion was made to accept the report as read; seconded and passed.

The Board Committee Chairs were next called upon to provide updates on their respective committees.

- Tim Cameron, Investments Chair
 NHPPA funds are invested in primarily global mutual stocks along with a couple individual issued bonds. The Board voted to invest a total of \$50,000 to start, and the investments were set up six months ago. The Association incurred an \$800 setup fee with our broker which has been recouped in the \$1,000 the assets have grown. The amount was higher, but the global economy recently suffered a significant drop. However, we are still better off than leaving the money in a low interest money market account. The game plan is to see a 5-6% rate of return.
- Jeannette Robichaud, Audit Chair
 An audit was performed on the FY2015-16 books. There were a couple minor findings that were not in compliance. Corrective actions were approved in June and have been implemented. The Audit Committee will perform quarterly reviews of the investment accounts starting in the

2016-17 fiscal year. Jeannette is currently developing an Audit Policy. The draft is pending review by the other committee members and will then be submitted to the Board for approval. Once approved it will be Policy #36 in the Policy and Procedures Manual.

- 3. Allison McGrail, Conference Chair
 - The 58th annual NHPPA conference will be held April 21-24, 2017 at The Margate Resort in Laconia. This year's theme is the "Wild West." Flyers highlighting the speaker lineup were available to those in attendance. All were encouraged to attend the event which is included in the membership dues. The schedule will follow a similar format as in previous years with the exception of an extended Tradeshow on Saturday during the image competition. The Tradeshow will be held from 12 noon to 4 p.m. in the Blackstones Lounge. Saturday is a free day open to the public. The online registration will be available soon and will include the option of purchasing a ticket for a bagged lunch during the Tradeshow, the pizza party, as well as the awards banquet.
- 4. Madonna Lovett Repeta, Conference Speakers Madonna shared the speaker lineup for the upcoming annual conference: Kira Derryberry who was recently featured on the cover of PPA Magazine will be speaking Friday night on how to capture character in your portraits (www.kiraderryberry.com); Jim Chagares on Sunday talking about wildlife photography. Although Jim's passion is wildlife, his techniques can be used for weddings and sports photography. Jim will also share techniques for editing (www.chagaresphotography.com); and Damon Tucci on Monday on the subject of weddings and social media (www.damontucci.com).
- 5. Ray Peeples, on behalf of Nylora Bruleigh Image Competition Chair The digital image competition will take place on Saturday, April 22. Nylora will have the print rules available on the website in early February; she is not anticipating any changes. Ray reminded those in attendance that the February monthly meeting is the annual print critique meeting and is a great opportunity to have your images reviewed by three talented judges in preparation for the image competition at conference.
- Ray Peeples, Webmaster
 The new NHPPA website has been up and running for a couple months now; still have some work to do on it. Ray also recommended that everyone take a look at the new updated NEIPP website as well.
- 7. Steve Robichaud, Conference Auction and Scholarship Chair Steve informed the members that he is currently collecting items for the conference auction taking place in April. All money raised goes to the general scholarships awarded in June. Qualified members were urged to consider donating one-on-one training for the auction. Any items not sold at auction will need to be taken home by the member who donated them. Anyone interested in helping out at the auction was encouraged to contact Steve.
- 8. Rick Hydren, Tradeshow Chair The Tradeshow for this year has been moved to Saturday, April 22, from 12 noon to 4 p.m. in the Blackstones Lounge. Club 79 will be held in the Blackstones Dining Area behind the bar. A bag lunch will be available for purchase at a nominal fee. Members were encouraged to send Eric at Hunt's an e-mail if there is a specific piece of gear they are interested in seeing, and Eric will bring it with him to the tradeshow if possible.

9. Jim Carlen and Tom Royer, Conference Hospitality A list will be setup soon so members can sign up to bring a variety of items to have available for hospitality each evening at the convention. Stay tuned!

10. Jean Wozniak, Conference Book Editor

Work has begun on the conference book. The goal is to have the books available for distribution at the March monthly meeting. Have received a printing estimate of \$924 which is covered with the money raised from advertising. All members were reminded to review their contact information as provided on the NHPPA website and provide any updates. This information will be downloaded and included in the conference book.

Bud Thorpe, Vendor Rep.

Bud told the membership that he had attended his first Board meeting and is excited to work with everyone. Bud's goal is to add more vendors to the membership, working with national folks to support NHPPA.

Tanya stated that she is looking for more member series highlighting what NHPPA has done for you. Tanya will be placing an ad in January on the public Facebook page.

Roland Lemire, on behalf of Michelle Trull – Best of Show Book Editor
 ACI printed the book again this year at a cost of \$40 per book. There were a total of 28 books sold at \$45 per book for a total revenue of \$1,260.

There was no old business to discuss. Confirmed that a quorum was present, so continued with voting on proposed changes to the Bylaws and the election of officers for the 2017-18 fiscal year.

Jean Wozniak, Chair of the Bylaws, Policies and Procedures Committee, was called upon to present the proposed changes to the NHPPA Bylaws.

The Board of Directors submitted the proposed changes to the BPP Committee for review. The Board approved the final version at the August 17, 2016 Board meeting and the changes were published in the November 2016 and January 2017 issues of the *Hyponeer*.

The following changes were presented to the membership for vote:

- a) Article VI, Section 1, Bullet Item 8 regarding the three directors who are included in the Board of Directors. Recommended to add "nominated and elected" each year and to remove the last sentence which states, "In 1997 it was originally implemented that one Director be elected for a term of one year, one Director to be elected for a term of two years, and one Director be elected for a term of three years in order to stagger the initial implementation." This last sentence is already covered by stating "until successors take office." The final language would read: "Three directors from the membership at large, one nominated and elected each year during the Annual Business Meeting, from nominations made from the floor, whose term shall be for three years or until successors take office." Motion made to accept change as presented, motion seconded. There was no discussion. Motion passed.
- b) Article III, Section 1, Item 1 Professional Photographer Membership Category The proposal was made to remove the word "joining" in the last sentence and add in additional language so that the last sentence would read, "A portfolio review is not needed, and will automatically be issued Professional status, for individuals who have 1) earned their PPA Masters of Photography degree or CPP designation, or 2) have achieved a combination of 10 average or above average images or prints from either PPA or affiliate competitions and/or NHPPA portfolio submission." A motion was made to accept the change as presented, motion seconded. There was further discussion about what would constitute the 10 average or above average images. It was explained that if a member had received an average score or higher on 5 images from either PPA or other PPA affiliate competitions, they would only need to submit an additional 5 images for a portfolio review which were deemed as average or above to be granted Professional status. There was a recommendation from the floor that only images receiving an above average score or higher in competition be eligible. It was stated that the purpose of the portfolio was to receive an average minimum. All members would continue to improve in their photography as they progress. There being no further discussion a vote was taken and the motion passed.
- c) Article VI, Section 1, Bullet Item 7 It was proposed to remove the Vendor Representative as a member of the Board of Directors. It was noted that at the time the Board approved this change, it was becoming increasingly difficult to fill the vendor rep position. However, after that vote, a person stepped forward and filled the position as Vendor Rep. That person is Bud Thorpe of SOPHA who is interested in serving on the Board of Directors. Since the proposed change had already been publicized to the membership, the Board could not rescind the change. A motion was made to not accept the proposed change as presented, motion seconded. There being no further discussion, the motion passed. The vendor rep will remain as a member of the Board of Directors.

Nominating Committee Chair Allison McGrail was called upon to present the slate of executive officers for the upcoming term beginning June 1, 2017 and ending May 31, 2018. The slate of officers include:

Secretary: Lauri West Treasurer: Open Position NH Rep to PPANE: Scott Snyder

A motion was made to accept the slate of officers as presented. Motion seconded and passed.

Nominations from the floor for the open three-year Director position were:

Tanya Hervey

Tanya accepted the nomination. There were no further nominations. A motion was made to accept Tanya Hervey to serve as Director for a 3-year term. Motion seconded and passed.

As the office of Treasurer remains open at this time, any interested member was encouraged to contact Allison McGrail.

President Roland Lemire adjourned the meeting at 8:45 p.m. A motion was made to accept; seconded and passed.
